

• What's the difference between Office 2021 (one-time purchase) and Microsoft 365 (subscription)?

Office 2021 is sold as a one-time purchase, which means you pay a single, upfront cost to get Office apps for one computer. One-time purchases are available for both PCs and Macs. However, there are no upgrade options, which means if you plan to upgrade to the next major release, you'll have to buy it at full price.

Microsoft 365 is a subscription that includes the most collaborative, up-todate features in one seamless, integrated experience. Microsoft 365 includes the robust Office desktop apps that you're familiar with, like Word, PowerPoint and Excel. You also get extra online storage and cloud-connected features that let you collaborate on files in real time. With a subscription, you'll always have the latest features, fixes and security updates along with ongoing tech support at no extra cost. You can choose to pay for your subscription on a monthly or yearly basis, and the Microsoft 365 Family plan lets you share your subscription with your family for up to six people, and use your apps on multiple PCs, Macs, tablets and phones.

• How do I know if my PC or Mac can run Microsoft 365?

Microsoft 365 is compatible with PC, Mac, Android and iOS. See <u>system</u> <u>requirements</u> for compatible versions of your devices, and for other feature requirements.

• Will Microsoft 365 be identical on a PC and on a Mac?

No. Microsoft 365's applications are tailored for each platform and each operating system. The applications available for Mac users and the specific features included may be different from those available for PC users. With Microsoft 365, you can be flexible. With your account, you are not limited to exclusively Mac or exclusively PC, so you can transition across devices.

• Do I keep control of my documents with a Microsoft 365 subscription?

Yes. Documents that you have created belong fully to you. You can choose to store them online on OneDrive or locally on your PC or Mac.

• Is internet access required for Microsoft 365?

Internet access is required to install and activate all the latest releases of apps and services included in all Microsoft 365 subscription plans. Note that if you are an existing subscriber, you do not need to reinstall or purchase another subscription.

For Microsoft 365 plans, Internet access is also needed to manage your subscription account, for example to install Office apps on other PCs or to change billing options. Internet access is also required to access documents stored on OneDrive, unless you install the <u>OneDrive desktop app</u>.

You should also connect to the internet regularly to keep your version of Microsoft 365 up to date and to benefit from automatic upgrades. If you do not connect to the internet at least every 31 days, your apps will go into reduced functionality mode, which means that you can view or print your documents but cannot edit the documents or create new ones. To reactivate your apps, simply reconnect to the Internet.

You do not need to be connected to the Internet to use the Office apps, such as Word, Excel and PowerPoint, because the apps are fully installed on your computer.

• What is a Microsoft account and why do I need it for Microsoft 365? Your Microsoft account is the combination of an email address and password that you use to sign in to services like OneDrive, Xbox LIVE and Outlook.com. If you use any of these services, you already have a Microsoft account that you can use, or you can create a new account. Learn more about Microsoft accounts.

As part of signing up for a trial or purchasing Microsoft 365, you will be prompted to sign in with a Microsoft account. You must be signed in with this account to install and manage your Microsoft 365 subscription, or to use some subscription benefits, including cloud storage.

• How many people can use a Microsoft 365 subscription?

You can share Microsoft 365 Family with five other people, for a total of six users. Microsoft 365 Personal can be used by one person.

• How do I share my subscription benefits with members of my family?

If you have an active Microsoft 365 Family subscription, you can share it with up to five other people. Each person you share your subscription with can install Microsoft 365 on all their devices and sign in to five devices at the same time.

To add someone to your subscription, sign in to your <u>Microsoft account</u> and follow the on-screen instructions to add a user. Each person you add will receive an email with the steps they need to follow. Once they have accepted and completed the steps, their information, including the installs they are using, will appear on their My Account page. You can stop sharing your subscription with someone or remove a device they are using by logging into your <u>Microsoft account</u>.

• What is Microsoft Defender?

Microsoft Defender is a cross-device security app that helps individuals and families protect their data and devices by continuously scanning the web for threats to your identity and personal data (US only). Defender also helps you stay safer online with malware protection, real-time security notifications and security tips. <u>Download the Microsoft Defender app.</u>

• What is the difference between Microsoft Defender and Windows Security?

Microsoft Defender is a new cross-device app that helps people and families stay safer online. Microsoft Defender adds new features and a simplified user interface. Microsoft Defender also brings valuable device protection to iOS, Android, Windows and Mac, with malware protection, web protection, real-time security notifications and security tips.^{Footnote1} Microsoft Defender is available in the Apple, Google and Microsoft app stores and requires a Microsoft 365 Personal or Family subscription to use.

Windows Security, formerly known as Windows Defender Security Centre, is built-in security on Windows PCs to protect your device and data. Windows Security is pre-installed and automatically enabled. Windows Security includes Microsoft Defender Antivirus software that protects your Windows device and data against viruses, ransomware, trojans and other malware unless non-Microsoft antivirus software is active.

• What is Clipchamp?

A free in-browser video editing platform designed to make video creation accessible for everyone.

What Is Microsoft 365?

Microsoft 365 is a way for businesses, and now consumers as well, to subscribe to Office, Teams, and other Microsoft software. Here are the details you need to know.

Microsoft 365 is an umbrella offering of software and services for organizations that launched in the summer of 2017. Because some may be scratching their heads as to what precisely Microsoft 365 *is*, we provide an explanation of what it's all about below. Microsoft representatives (who also call it M365) describe the product as Office 365 plus <u>Windows 10</u> plus Enterprise Mobility.

Update: In March 2020, the company unveiled a version of <u>Microsoft 365 for</u> <u>consumers</u>. That offering differs from the business plans, and it replaces Office 365 plans. It includes not only the Office apps, but also OneDrive cloud storage, Outlook, Family Safety (including apps for Android and iOS),

and Teams for Families. It also includes new consumer-targeted <u>finance</u> <u>templates</u> for Excel, and AI-powered style checking for Word.

The offering has been a success at attracting customers: At a recent <u>Goldman Sachs conference</u> last month, Microsoft Corporate Vice President Jared Spataro stated that "over a quarter of Office 365 licenses are being purchased through M365 or through Microsoft 365."

The Microsoft Graph

Microsoft 365 is available in three flavours: Business, Enterprise, and Education. Pricing starts at \$20 per user per month for the Business level, which gets you all of Office 365. According to my Microsoft contact, however, "Pricing varies based on factors such as seat volume and total services provided by the Microsoft partner involved in the sale."

Microsoft 365 leverages the Microsoft Graph, which is basically all the data you produce based on your activity in Office apps, in the <u>Edge web browser</u>, and on Microsoft's mobile apps, including the Edge and Office apps for iOS and Android. There are other inputs as well, such as web-indexing data from Bing, Outlook.com mail, Azure Active Directory, SharePoint, and business data from LinkedIn.

That data is just the start of the Graph, however. Its special sauce is the Microsoft AI and machine learning applied to it. An example of this is the new grammar-learning capabilities in Word. Cloud services can learn grammar patterns and propose more types of corrections. It will know, for example, that it's more correct to say "I saw fog in the air" rather than "I saw the fog in the air," based on lots of data showing the correct usage.

The Graph isn't just for Microsoft apps: Developers can use Graph APIs to build more proactive and smarter apps of their own using all that intelligence via Azure cloud services. For example, a company could use the APIs to build a custom administrator's console.

What's New in Microsoft 365?

Since Microsoft 365 includes Windows 10 and Office 365, the case could be made that every new feature in those is a new Microsoft 365 feature. One new feature specific to the service is Insider Risk Management. This uses AI to monitor risky situations such as a departing employee downloading sensitive business files. It checks for simple security mistakes as well as for malicious actions. The protection is important, as a survey showed that 90 percent of organizations felt vulnerable to insider risk, and half of the respondents had experienced insider breaches in the previous year.

A related new tool is Advanced Audit for Microsoft 365. This Enterprise feature adds the following capabilities:

• Extending the preservation of a user's audit activities from 90 days to



- Access to crucial events for investigations

Windows 10's Your Phone app is a <u>window on the PC</u> that shows photos, notifications, and messages from Android mobile devices. Microsoft still hasn't gotten Your Phone capabilities to work with iOS, but Microsoft 365 MDM capabilities do work with iPhones. You'll likely see more features with Android, since Apple locks down its OS features more. But a Microsoft rep said Your Phone will indeed work with iOS sometime.


Office and M365

Of course, a huge part of M365 is Office 365. The adaptive cards that appear in Outlook and <u>Teams</u> messages change to reflect changes in your organization's Microsoft Graph data. A manager could approve an expense report right in a card. You'll also be able to pay bills in a card using Microsoft Pay. Cards are adaptive and actionable, as the buttons in the card below show.



Mobile

In addition to the mobile app integrations mentioned above, Microsoft 365 includes <u>mobile device management</u> capabilities. This lets IT staff deploy app and security settings to Android and iOS devices as well as to <u>Windows</u> <u>tablets</u> and desktops. The system doesn't offer automatic deployment on the mobile OSes, but does allow this on Windows 10 devices. You can set security policies to take effect on all platforms.



Cloud Storage and Services

As you might expect, Microsoft throws in <u>OneDrive</u> online storage and sharing, as well as access to all the Office web apps, for when you don't have one of your own devices handy. Microsoft 365 users get the same 1TB of OneDrive cloud storage <u>Office 365</u> subscribers get, along with Microsoft Teams accounts. They also get customizable SharePoint team intranet sites.

Security

Microsoft 365 offers better security than what you'd get with a simple Office 365 subscription, including Advanced Threat Protection, remote wiping capability, App protection (which restricts copying or saving proprietary data in mobile apps), Windows Defender Exploit Guard, and unlimited cloud archiving for Exchange email.

Is Microsoft 365 Cannibalizing Windows and Office?

At first glance, it could seem like Windows and Office are being subsumed by Microsoft 365. But really, it's just that the company wants to promote the new offering for businesses and organizations. Windows and Office aren't going anywhere, and indeed, they'll benefit from some of the features introduced for Microsoft 365.







Microsoft 365 is a product family of <u>productivity software</u>, collaboration and <u>cloud-based services</u> owned by <u>Microsoft</u>. It encompasses online services such as <u>Outlook.com</u>, <u>OneDrive</u>, <u>Microsoft Teams</u>, programs formerly marketed under the name <u>Microsoft Office</u> (including applications such as <u>Word</u>, <u>Excel</u>, <u>PowerPoint</u>, and <u>Outlook</u> on <u>Microsoft Windows</u>, <u>macOS</u>, <u>mobile devices</u>, and <u>on the web</u>), enterprise products and services associated with these products such as <u>Exchange</u> <u>Server</u>, <u>SharePoint</u>, and <u>Viva Engage</u>. It also covers subscription plans encompassing these products, including those that include subscription-based licenses to desktop and mobile software, and hosted email and intranet services.

The branding **Office 365** was introduced in 2010 to refer to a subscription-based software as a service platform for the corporate market, including hosted services such as Exchange, SharePoint, and Lync Server, and Office on the web. Some plans also included licenses for the <u>Microsoft Office 2010</u> software. Upon the release of <u>Office 2013</u>, Microsoft began to promote the service as the primary distribution model for the Microsoft Office suite, adding consumer-focused plans integrating with services such as OneDrive and <u>Skype</u>, and emphasizing ongoing feature updates (as opposed to non-subscription <u>licenses</u>, where new versions require purchase of a new license, and do not receive feature updates).

In July 2017, Microsoft introduced a second brand of subscription services for the enterprise market known as Microsoft 365, combining Office 365 with <u>Windows</u> <u>10</u> Enterprise <u>volume licenses</u> and other cloud-based <u>security</u> and <u>device</u> <u>management</u> products. On April 21, 2020, Office 365 was rebranded as Microsoft 365, to emphasize the service's current inclusion of products and services beyond the core Microsoft Office software family (including cloud-based productivity tools and <u>artificial intelligence</u> features). Most products that were called Office 365 were renamed as Microsoft 365 on the same day.²² In October 2022, Microsoft announced that it would discontinue the "Microsoft Office" brand by January 2023, with most of its products and online productivity services being marketed primarily under the "Microsoft 365" brand.¹³¹⁴¹⁶¹ It continues to reside on the domain name <u>office365.com</u>, whereas personal (non-education/enterprise) accounts are on <u>live.com</u>. However, Microsoft reversed this stance with the release of an Office 2024 preview build in November 2023.¹⁶¹⁷

History[edit]

As Office 365[edit]

Microsoft first announced Office 365 in October 2010, beginning with a <u>private</u> <u>beta</u> with various organizations, leading into a public beta in April 2011, and reaching general availability on June 28, 2011, with a launch aimed originally at <u>corporate</u> users. Facing growing competition from <u>Google</u>'s similar service <u>Google</u> <u>Workspace</u>, Microsoft designed the Office 365 platform to "bring together" its existing online services (such as the <u>Business Productivity Online Suite</u>) into "an always-upto-date cloud service" incorporating <u>Exchange Server</u> (for e-mail), <u>SharePoint</u> (for internal social networking, collaboration, and a public web site), and <u>Lync</u> (for communication, <u>VoIP</u>, and conferencing). Plans were initially launched for small business and enterprises; the small business plan offered Exchange e-mail, SharePoint Online, Lync Online, web hosting via SharePoint, and the <u>Web App</u> with the enterprise plan also adding per-user licenses for the Office 2010 Professional Plus software and 24/7 phone support.^[10] Following the official launch of the service, Business Productivity Online Suite customers were given 12 months to migrate from BPOS to the Office 365 platform.^[10]

With the release of <u>Office 2013</u>, an updated version of the Office 365 platform was launched on February 27, 2013, expanding Office 365 to include new plans aimed at different types of businesses, along with new plans aimed at general consumers, including benefits tailored towards Microsoft consumer services such as <u>OneDrive</u> (whose integration with Office was a major feature of the 2013 suite).^[11] The server components were updated to their respective 2013 versions, and Microsoft expanded the Office 365 service with new plans, such as Small Business

Premium, Midsize Premium, and Pro Plus.^[12] A new Office 365 Home Premium plan aimed at home users offers access to the Office 2013 suite for up to five computers, along with expanded <u>OneDrive</u> storage and 60 minutes of Skype calls monthly. The plan is aimed at mainstream consumers, especially those who want to install Office on multiple computers.^{[13][14]} A University plan was introduced, targeted at postsecondary students. With these new offerings, Microsoft began to offer prepaid Office 365 subscriptions through retail outlets alongside the normal, perpetually licensed editions of Office 2013 (which are only licensed for use on one computer, and do not receive feature updates).^{[15][16]}

On March 19, 2013, Microsoft detailed its plans to provide integration with the enterprise <u>social networking</u> platform <u>Yammer</u> (which they had acquired in 2012) for Office 365, such as the ability to use a <u>single sign-on</u> between the two services, shared feeds and document aggregation, and the ability to entirely replace the SharePoint news feed and social functionality with Yammer.^[17] The ability to provide a link to a Yammer network from an Office 365 portal was introduced in June 2013, with heavier integration (such as a Yammer app for SharePoint and single sign-on) to be introduced in July 2013.^[18]

On July 8, 2013, Microsoft unveiled <u>Power BI</u>, a suite of <u>business intelligence</u> and self-serve <u>data mining</u> tools for Office 365, to be released later in the year. Power BI is primarily incorporated into Excel, allowing users to use the <u>Power Query</u> tool to create spreadsheets and graphs using public and <u>private data</u>, and also perform <u>geovisualization</u> with <u>Bing Maps</u> data using the Power Map tool (previously available as a beta plug-in known as GeoFlow). Users will also be able to access and publish reports, and perform natural language queries on data.^[19]20] As a limitedtime offer for certain markets (but notably excluding the US), Microsoft also offered a free one-year <u>Xbox Live</u> Gold subscription with any purchase of an Office 365 Home Premium or University subscription, until September 28, 2013.^[21]

From April 15, 2014, Microsoft renamed the "Home Premium" plan to "Home," and added a new "Personal" plan for single users.^{[22][23]}

In June 2014, the amount of OneDrive storage offered to Office 365 subscribers was increased to 1 <u>terabyte</u> from 20 GB.^[24] On October 27, 2014, Microsoft announced "unlimited" OneDrive storage for Office 365 subscribers.^[25] However, due to abuse and a general reduction in storage options implemented by Microsoft, the 1 TB cap was reinstated in November 2015.^[26]

In June 2016, Microsoft made <u>Planner</u> available for general release. It is considered to be a competitor to <u>Trello</u> and to other agile team collaboration cloud services.^[27]

In April 2017, Microsoft announced that with the ending of mainstream support for <u>Office 2016</u> on October 13, 2020, access to <u>OneDrive for Business</u> and Office 365-hosted servers for Skype for Business will become unavailable to those who are not using Office 365 ProPlus or Office perpetual in mainstream support.^[20] In July 2019, Microsoft announced that the hosted <u>Skype for Business</u> Online service would be discontinued on July 31, 2021, with users being redirected to the <u>Microsoft</u> <u>Teams</u> collaboration platform as its replacement. Since September 2019, Skype for Business Online is no longer offered to new subscribers.^[20]30]

In October 2017, the existing Outlook.com Premium service was discontinued and folded exclusively into Office 365, with all Personal and Family subscribers subsequently being upgraded to 50 GB of storage.^[31]

As Microsoft 365[edit]

For businesses[edit]

The "Microsoft 365" brand was first introduced at <u>Microsoft Inspire</u> in July 2017 as an enterprise subscription product, succeeding the "Secure Productive Enterprise" services released in 2016, and combining <u>Windows 10</u> Enterprise with Office 365 Business Premium, and the Enterprise Mobility + Security suite including Advanced Threat Analytics, <u>Azure Active Directory</u>, Azure Information Protection, Cloud App Security and <u>Microsoft Intune</u>. Microsoft 365 is sold via Microsoft and its cloud services reseller network.^{[32]33}

Consumer launch[edit]

On March 30, 2020, Microsoft announced that the consumer plans of Office 365 would be rebranded as "Microsoft 365" (a brand also used by Microsoft for an enterprise subscription bundle of Windows, Office 365, and security services) on April 21, 2020, succeeding existing consumer plans of Office 365.^[34]

It is a superset of the existing Office 365 products and benefits, positioned towards "life", productivity, and families, including the <u>Microsoft Office</u> suite, 1 TB of additional <u>OneDrive</u> storage and access to OneDrive Personal Vault, and 60 minutes of <u>Skype</u> calls per month. Under the brand, Microsoft will also add access to its collaboration platform <u>Teams</u> (which will also add additional features designed around family use), and a premium tier of <u>Microsoft Family Safety</u>. Microsoft also announced plans to offer trial offers of third-party services for Microsoft 365 subscribers, with companies such as <u>Adobe</u> (<u>Creative Cloud</u> Photography), <u>Blinkist</u>, CreativeLive, <u>Experian</u>, and <u>Headspace</u> having partnered. Microsoft 365 Personal and Family succeeded the Office 365 Personal and Home subscriptions, with no change in pricing.^{[85]36[]37][38]}

Office 365 for small- and medium-sized businesses was also renamed Microsoft 365, with Office 365 Business and ProPlus becoming "Microsoft 365 Apps for business" and "Microsoft 365 Apps for enterprise", Office 365 Business Essentials becoming "Microsoft 365 Business Basic", and Office 365 Business Premium becoming "Microsoft 365 Business Standard" (with the existing Microsoft 365 Business product becoming "Microsoft 365 Business Premium"). The Office 365 brand remains in use for its enterprise, education, healthcare, and governmental plans. Microsoft stated that "over the last several years, our cloud productivity offering has grown well beyond what people traditionally think of as 'Office'", citing examples such as Forms, Planner, Stream, and Teams.^[39]

On October 13, 2022, Microsoft announced that it would be phasing out the Microsoft Office brand, in favor of branding all products under the Microsoft 365 name. This change took effect on <u>Office.com</u> in November 2022, followed by the Office mobile apps in January 2023. The Microsoft Office brand will still be used for legacy products, including subscription products still carrying the "Office 365" name since the previous Microsoft 365 rebranding, and the "on-premises"/perpetually licensed <u>Microsoft Office 2021</u>.^[40]16]

Software and services

Desktop applications

Main article: List of Microsoft 365 applications and services

The Microsoft 365 desktop applications (formerly marketed as <u>Microsoft Office</u>) are primarily used on <u>personal computers</u> running <u>Microsoft Windows</u>, and are distributed as part of the Microsoft 365 subscription. They are installed using a "clickto-run" system which allows users to begin using the applications almost instantaneously, while files are <u>downloaded in the background</u>. Updates to the software are installed automatically, covering both security and feature updates. These applications were one of the core components of the initial Office 365 service.^{[11][14][15][11]} If the user's subscription lapses, the applications enter a <u>readonly</u> mode where editing functionality is disabled. Full functionality is restored once a new subscription is purchased and activated.^[42]

Although there are still "on-premises" or "perpetual" releases of Office released on a three-year cycle, these versions do not receive new features or access to new cloud-based services as they are released on Microsoft 365.

All of these applications, excluding <u>Access</u> and <u>Publisher</u>, are also available on <u>macOS</u>.

- Microsoft Word is a word processing application for editing documents.
- <u>Microsoft Excel</u> is a <u>spreadsheet</u> editor.
- <u>Microsoft PowerPoint</u> is a presentation program.
- <u>Microsoft OneNote</u> is a <u>notetaking program</u> that gathers handwritten or typed notes, drawings, <u>screen clippings</u> and audio commentaries. Notes can be shared with other OneNote users over the Internet or a network.
- <u>Microsoft Outlook</u> is a <u>personal information manager</u> (PIM) that includes an e-mail client, calendar, task manager and address book.
- Microsoft Publisher is a <u>desktop publishing</u> app for Windows mostly used for designing brochures, labels, calendars, greeting cards, business cards, newsletters, web sites, and postcards.
- Microsoft Access is a database management system for Windows that combines the <u>relational Access Database Engine</u> (formerly Jet Database Engine) with a graphical user interface and software development tools. Microsoft Access stores data in its own format based on the Access Database Engine. It can also import or link directly to data stored in other applications and databases.^[46]

Mobile and web applications

Word, Excel, and PowerPoint are available as <u>mobile</u> and <u>web app</u>, usable for free with limitations, although they do not contain all of the functionality as the desktop versions. The mobile apps were originally limited to Office 365 subscribers,^{[47][48][49]} but basic editing and document creation has since been made free for personal use. An active Microsoft 365 subscription is still required to unlock certain advanced editing features, use the apps on devices with screens larger than 10.1 inches, or to use the apps for commercial purposes.^{[50][51][52]} In February 2020, Microsoft introduced a new Microsoft Office app that integrates Word, Excel, and PowerPoint, replacing the previous, separate apps for each.^[53]

Microsoft Outlook for mobile is derived from the apps <u>Acompli</u> and <u>Sunrise Calendar</u>, which were acquired by Microsoft and discontinued.^{[54][55][56]}

Online services and apps

Some Microsoft 365 online services are usable without a subscription, but with limitations such as <u>advertising</u> and lower storage limits.

- <u>Outlook.com</u>, an online <u>webmail</u> service originally launched as Hotmail, also including an address book (People) and <u>calendar</u>.
- <u>OneDrive</u>, an <u>online file storage</u> service.
- Office on the web, cloud-based versions of Word, Excel, and PowerPoint; they compete primarily with services such as <u>Google Docs</u>.
- Microsoft Teams, a business communication platform.
- <u>To Do</u>, a <u>task management</u> app.
- <u>Clipchamp</u>, an online <u>video editor</u>.[57]
- **<u>Skype</u>**, an <u>instant messaging</u> and <u>VOIP</u> service.
- Microsoft Family Safety is a service encompassing <u>parental controls</u> that can be used across Windows, Android, iOS, and <u>Xbox</u> devices for <u>web filtering</u>, time limits, location sharing, and other features.

Enterprise servers and services

Business and enterprise-oriented plans for Microsoft/Office 365 offer access to <u>cloud-hosted</u> server platforms on a <u>software as a service</u> basis, including Exchange, Skype for Business, SharePoint, Microsoft Dictate (<u>speech</u> <u>recognition[60[61]</u>), and <u>Office on the web.[8]</u> Through SharePoint's OneDrive for Business functionality (formerly known as SharePoint MySites and SkyDrive Pro, and distinct from the consumer-oriented <u>OneDrive service</u>), each user also receives 1 TB of online storage. Certain plans also include unlimited personal cloud storage per user.^{[62][63]}

Microsoft 365 services can be configured through an online portal; users can be added manually, imported from a <u>CSV file</u>, or set up for <u>single sign-on</u> with a local <u>Active Directory</u> using <u>Active Directory Federation Services</u>.^{[10][64]} More advanced setup and features requires the use of <u>PowerShell</u> scripts.^[65]

- Exchange Server, a mail and calendaring server.
- SharePoint is a web-based <u>collaborative platform</u>. It is primarily sold as a <u>document</u> management and storage system, but the product is highly configurable and usage varies substantially among organizations.
- <u>Microsoft Power Platform</u> is a line of <u>business intelligence</u>, <u>app development</u>, and <u>app</u> <u>connectivity</u> applications.
- <u>Viva Engage</u>, a platform for creating <u>enterprise social networks</u>.

Subscription plans

Microsoft 365 offers subscription plans aimed at different needs and market segments, providing different sets of features at different price points.^{[60][07]} Microsoft has also offered Office 365 subscriptions to students of institutions who have licensed Office software for their faculty.^{[60][09]} There are two separate backends for the products:^{[70][71]}

- Consumer plans log in using a Microsoft account, also called a "personal account"
- Business, enterprise and education plans log in using a user ID managed by <u>Azure</u>
 <u>Active Directory</u>, also called a "work or school account"

Consumer

Aimed at mainstream consumers, both plans offer access to <u>Microsoft</u> <u>Office</u> applications (<u>Word</u>, <u>Excel</u>, <u>PowerPoint</u>, <u>Outlook</u>, <u>Publisher</u>, and <u>Access</u>) for home/non-commercial use on one computer (<u>Windows</u>, <u>macOS</u>, and mobile devices), with access to additional online-based services and premium creative content, 1 TB of <u>OneDrive</u> storage with Advanced Security, 60 minutes of <u>Skype</u> international calls per month (subject to area), and partner offers.^{[72][73][74][75]}

- Microsoft 365 Personal (formerly Office 365 Personal): Includes access to Word, Excel, PowerPoint, Outlook, Publisher, and Access for home/non-commercial use on up to five computers, phones or tablets (Windows, Mac, Android, iOS). Additional benefits include 1 TB of additional <u>OneDrive</u> storage and 60 minutes of <u>Skype</u> international calls per month (subject to area).^{[72][76]} A version of Personal purchased on a discounted four-year plan, known as Office 365 University, allowing use on two devices by one user, was available for those in <u>post-secondary</u> institutions until 2019.^[27]
- **Microsoft 365 Family** (formerly Office 365 Home): Aimed at mainstream consumers and families; same as Personal, but for use on up to five devices per person by up to six users.^[78]

Small Business

- **Microsoft 365 Apps for business** (formerly Office 365 Business): Offers Office applications for Windows, Mac, and mobile platforms for up to five computers, tablets, and smartphones per user.
- Microsoft 365 Business Basic (formerly Office 365 Business Essentials) is suitable for small and medium-sized businesses. It includes Office 365 webapps: Word, Excel, Outlook, PowerPoint, OneNote, as well as Exchange, Teams, SharePoint, OneDrive, Forms and Visio with 1 TB.
- **Microsoft 365 Business Standard** (formerly Office 365 Business Premium) includes Microsoft 365 Business Basic and Microsoft 365 Apps for Business.
- Microsoft 365 Business Premium (formerly Microsoft 365 Business) is for businesses with up to 300 employees. It includes Microsoft 365 Business Standard and additionally: Windows 10 Business, <u>Azure Virtual Desktop</u>, Azure AD P1, <u>Microsoft Intune</u>, Defender for Business, Defender for Office 365.^[79]

Enterprise

- Microsoft 365 Apps for Enterprise (formerly Office 365 ProPlus)
- Office 365 Enterprise: Intended for use in corporate environments. Provides access to all Office applications and hosted services, as well as business-specific features and regulatory compliance support.
- **Microsoft 365 Enterprise**: is a bundle of Office 365 Enterprise, <u>Windows 10</u> <u>Enterprise</u> and Enterprise Mobility + Security.^{[80][81]}

Education

• Microsoft 365 Education^[82]

Other

 Office 365 operated by 21Vianet: Microsoft has licensed <u>21Vianet</u> to provide Office 365 services to its <u>China</u> customers. Microsoft does not operate Office 365 in China; instead, 21Vianet does. Security

In December 2011, Microsoft announced that the Office 365 platform was now compliant with the <u>ISO/IEC 27001</u> security standards, the <u>European Union</u>'s <u>Data</u> <u>Protection Directive</u> (through the signing of <u>model clauses</u>), and the <u>Health</u> <u>Insurance Portability and Accountability Act</u> for <u>health care</u> environments in the United States. At the same time, Microsoft also unveiled a new "Trust Center" portal, containing further information on its privacy policies and security practices for the service.^[91]92] In May 2012, Microsoft announced that Office 365 was now compliant with the <u>Federal Information Security Management Act</u>: compliance with the act would now allow Office 365 to be used by U.S. government agencies.^[93]

In spite of claiming to comply with European data protection standards, and in spite of existing <u>Safe Harbor</u> agreements, Microsoft has admitted that it will not refrain from handing over data stored on its European servers to US authorities under the <u>Patriot Act</u>.^[94]

In <u>Finland</u>, <u>FICORA</u> has warned Office 365 users of phishing incidents and break-ins that have caused losses of millions of euros.^[95]99] In September 2019, NCSC-FI (National Cyber Security Centre of Finland) created a detailed guide on how to protect Microsoft Office 365 against phishing attempts and any data breaches.^[97]

In July 2019, the German state of <u>Hesse</u> outlawed the use of Office 365 in educational institutions, citing privacy risks.^[93]

In December 2020, the <u>US Department of Commerce was breached</u> via Office 365. The attackers were able to access staff emails for several months.^[99]100]

A July 1, 2021 <u>cybersecurity</u> advisory from British (<u>NCSC</u>) and American (<u>NSA</u>, <u>FBI</u>, <u>CISA</u>) security agencies warned of a <u>GRU brute-force</u> campaign from mid-2019 to the present (July 2021) that focused a "significant amount" of activity on Microsoft Office 365 cloud services.^{[101][102]}

On November 10, 2023, IT news portal *Heise online* disclosed in the article "Microsoft lays hands on login data: Beware of the new Outlook", that "if you try out the new Outlook, you risk transferring your IMAP and SMTP credentials of mail accounts and all your emails to Microsoft servers."^[103]

Reception[edit]

<u>TechRadar</u> gave the 2013 update of Office 365 a 4.5 out of 5, praising its administration interfaces for being accessible to users with any level of expertise, the seamless integration of OneDrive Pro into the Office 2013 desktop applications, and the service as a whole for being suitable in small business environments, while still offering "powerful" options for use in larger companies (such as <u>data loss</u> <u>protection</u> and the ability to integrate with a local <u>Active Directory</u> instance). However, the service was severely criticized for how it handled its 2013 update for existing users, and its lack of integration with services such as <u>Skype</u> and <u>Viva</u> <u>Engage</u>.^[64]

In the fourth quarter of fiscal year 2017, Office 365 revenue had exceeded that of conventional license sales of Microsoft Office software for the first time.^[104]

The office suites updates includes better support for the <u>OASIS OpenDocument</u> file format. The version update adds features to the LET function, has better search for XMATCH function, dynamic arrays, XLOOKUP.^[10] It enhances Ink for Translate in <u>Microsoft Outlook</u> and <u>PowerPoint</u>.

Default font change[edit]

Midway through the life cycle of Office 2021, in July 2023 – after two years of evaluating five newly commissioned fonts – ¹⁵ the default font across all Office applications was changed to Aptos.¹¹⁶ This marked the first time since Office 2007 that Microsoft had changed default fonts.
