AGM SUMMARY

Our third AGM was held on April 4th – brought forward to earlier in the year as that made reports and the financial statement of the previous year more relevant.

60+ members attended and 25+ voted in advance so our Constitutional quorum was met.

The Chair's address focused on our continued growth and successes along with the challenges including major changes in the management of the Third Age Trust. "Nevertheless, it will be quite some time before we manage to achieve all that needs to be done and I would like to remind you that this is my final year that is allowed for a Chair and we are looking for interested people to come on board as soon as possible so they can shadow me in my last few months. We are a unique organisation in that we are run by the members for the members. I would ask you to consider what sort of volunteer you are – I can assure you there is something for everybody! You can always approach any committee member for further information about any volunteer roles. I can only assure you that you would be joining a truly supportive and helpful bunch of people."

Following the address there was quite a vigorous debate about our ongoing relationship with Tendring u3a. A series of votes was held with members (present) agreeing that we would continue to welcome TD members to our groups and social events but that there seemed little purpose in continuing to expect any of the promised monies.

Reports from post-holders and the financial statement were received and accepted.

The Third Age Trust is increasing the amount being charged to u3as for Third Age Matters but not all members opt to receive this magazine. In light of this, your committee has decided that it is not entirely fair for members who choose not to take the u3a Matters magazine to subsidise those who do. Therefore to receive the magazine next year it is proposed that this will be an opt-in, not an opt-out. All members will pay £16 but those opting to take delivery of the magazine will pay £4 for the service. This works out at less than £1 per copy and I am sure you will agree this is very good value. No questions were asked and a formal vote carried the resolution.

Lorry Greenall was proposed, seconded and voted to continue as Chairman. Mark Riley, Karen Riley, Karen Woolley, Kate Collins and Angela Hillier were proposed, seconded and voted to continue in their roles.

Gill Bridgwater stood down as Membership Secretary and was thanked for all her work in taking over the role just at its busiest (renewal) time. The Committee will be seeking ways to divide up the role to make it somewhat easier in the future.

No notification of other business had been received.

A vote of thanks was given to the Committee by Hilary Russell.

A humorous poem was read by Pauline Pattison which greatly lightened the atmosphere and refreshments were served.

BE KIND TO VOLUNTEERS

We have a Members Code of Conduct on the website which says that Members are expected to treat each other with dignity and respect at all times




